It was something that was needed because of the shrubs and vegetation that tore at the cowboys legs. God gives us wonderful protection by providing His Word for us as His children. Cowboy Hat -

The cowboy hat was used for protection from the sun, but it was also useful and functional to the cowboy. On their cattle drives, the cowboys could signal with their hat and also use it to dip water out of streams when they were thirsty. It's such a wonderful thing that the Lord is always there to shade us if we just stay close to Him. We can be shaded and dip into His Word and into the power of prayer and be refreshed in Him.

Saddle -

Saddles were originally used for working cattle ranchers. As Christians, we are set apart to work. We have a job to do.
